Mayor Naughton called the Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Spring Lake to order at 4:00 P.M. with a moment of silent prayer. She then proceeded with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor announced that the meeting is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings.

## Public Comments

Lyle Marlowe, 110 Pennsylvania Avenue, stated that although the boardwalk looks great there are a couple of areas that are missing railings and areas of piping that have no fittings. Mayor Naughton responded that additional consideration is being given to placing railings on the west side and that the issue is still under discussion. Mr. Marlowe also commented that the beach staff is doing a terrific job but reported that he saw some staff members operating vehicles while texting. The Mayor responded that there is a clear policy in place regarding this and that it will be enforced.

Eleanor Twomey, Vroom Avenue, commented that this is the first rain date of the season.

## **Council Comments & Staff Reports**

Mr. Drasheff reported that the County has announced the tax rate for the Borough. Mr. Drasheff shared details including a reduction in the school levy and the local levy being down close to \$21,000 resulting in the county budget being increased by \$427,000. Mr. Drasheff expressed his concern about these numbers and shared his feelings of the Borough being penalized for doing a good job of maintaining the town. Mr. Drasheff expressed further concern about a recent article stating that the County budget had a zero increase in the tax levy. Mr. Drasheff suggested that the Finance Committee meet to identify ways to possibly lower this levy in future years. Mrs. Reilly suggested the County be invited to visit the Borough and explain the increase from the County. The Mayor agreed to pull the Finance Committee together to discuss. CFO Robbin Kirk explained how the increase will be allocated over the next four (4) quarters noting that the first two quarters of 2013 are basically an estimate while the last two quarters of 2012 will reflect the estimate plus additional taxes due from any increase. In closing, Mr. Drasheff acknowledged Mr. Frank Phillips and his staff for their work in getting the leak fixed on the roof of the Municipal Building which was affecting the Historical Society.

Mrs. Venables reported on the need for amendments to ordinances in connection with the Shade Tree Committee's work. Specifically, Mrs. Venables noted the need to address the type of trees that may be planted, the fees collected for tree permits, the requirement of tree permits in the case of home renovations and new construction. Mrs. Venables reinforced the importance of the tree fund as a way to ensure that the Borough's tree stock is maintained and to ensure the Borough has funds to add trees to public spaces and the right-of-ways. Mrs. Venables requested Council's authorization to have Borough Attorney Colao begin work on amendments to the tree ordinances.

# BOROUGH OF SPRING LAKE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COUNCIL JULY 19, 2012

Mrs. Venables offered a motion to authorize Borough Attorney Colao to draft amendments to the Borough's tree Ordinances, seconded by Mrs. Reilly. ROLL CALL: AYES: Mr. Drasheff, Mrs. Venables, Mr. Jordan, Mr. Judge, Mrs. Reilly NAYS: NONE ABSENT: Mr. Fay ABSTAIN: NONE

Mrs. Venables continued sharing an update on a tree replacement project on Third Avenue. She reported that the Bradford Pear trees, which were planted approximately 15-18 years ago, have reached their end of life. The BID is supportive and willing to assist with fundraising for this project, added Mrs. Venables. The Chamber is also supportive and the Shade Tree Committee has a member who is a landscape architect who is willing to do a tree plan and make recommendations for the project. Although her time would be Pro Bono, stated Mrs. Venables, she would give the Borough an estimate for any additional costs. Mrs. Reilly interjected that their is a fundraising event planned in connection with the BID's activities of which a portion of the monies raised may be allocated to the tree project. Mrs. Venables detailed the information that is needed for the planning of the project including a CAD survey which would be done by Borough Engineer Avakian as part of the overall Third Avenue project. Mrs. Venables asked Mr. Avakian to offer details regarding cost. Mr. Avakian noted that the field survey work is complete which resulted in a base map for the streetscape. Mr. Avakian confirmed that the charges for what the Shade Tree Committee needs will most likely be included in the overall Third Avenue project.

Mrs. Venables concluded her remarks with an update on Wreck Pond noting that Mr. Avakian and Mr. Dempsey met with the County and they are in support of the dredging application for the Wreck Pond work. Mr. Avakian interjected that the applications should be signed within the next couple of weeks which gives the state and Army Corps more than three months to review before November with a target to coordinate the project between November and December and execute the work in December or January. Mr. Avakian reported that the permit is \$3,500 and the Letter of Interpretation is \$600. Mayor Naughton explained the need for the permit and letter in connection with the project. Mr. Avakian detailed the timeline and DEP's support of the timeline. The Mayor invited Mr. Avakian to continue and offer an update on the environmental study. Mr. Avakian noted that they recently met with a FEMA representative and the environmental project manager from FEMA and unfortunately continue to be asked from more tasks to be competed. Further, agreement was reached identifying the pumping as the primary project, which is what the funding was for, and all other improvements will be secondary. Mr. Avakian and Mr. Dempsey reported that FEMA has agreed to a deadline of one month for the approval to move forward.

Lyle Marlowe, Pennsylvania Avenue, inquired as to whether the County was involved in the environmental assessment. Mr. Avakian noted that they are not connected to the environmental assessment yet they would be involved in the dredging portion. Mayor Naughton noted that the environmental study is required for the release of the FEMA money.

Mr. Marlowe then asked about the amount of funds being collected by the Shade Tree Committee. Mrs. Venables responded that the amount is approximately \$34,000 prior to any planting for this year including the Third Avenue project. Mrs. Venables and Mayor Naughton reiterated that it's funded entirely by residents taking trees down during construction projects.

Mr. Jordan reported that the Pavilion Revenue Committee has been working with CFO Kirk regarding an accounting of sales for lockers and badges for 2012. Mr. Jordan also reported that the Lake Como Radio Tower Committee will be reconvening soon to address anticipated movement on the application.

Mr. Judge reported that the Tower Committee is monitoring activities related to the tower and it appears that Greater Media, the company that owns the tower, submitted a variance application to possibly increase the height of the tower in its present location. Mr. Judge stated that this may be an attempt to

gain leverage and to put pressure on the Lake Como Council to move forward on construction of the tower in the other location. Mr. Judge also expressed thanks to Mr. Drasheff for his efforts in staying on top of the County in connection with the tax levy.

Mr. Judge reported on Chris Herring's talk at Devine Park noting that it was well attended by approximately 200-300 people including over 200 children. Mr. Judge described his talk as "compelling" keeping the audience "riveted".

Mr. Judge stated that a complaint has been filed with the County by neighbors of Mountz School in connection with the plans to construct a playground and basketball court. The complaint is seeking an injunction preventing the Board of Education from moving forward with the current plan. Mr. Judge also reported that he has contacted all parties involved in an effort to follow up on the request to discuss potential restrictions on the use of the facilities.

Mrs. Reilly also commented on Mr. Herring's talk noting that it was indeed a compelling talk and Mrs. Reilly thanked Paul and Erin on a wonderful job putting the program together. Mrs. Reilly also thanked Mr. Dempsey and all those involved in completing the South End Pool and noted that it looks wonderful. Mrs. Reilly stated that there are a lot of bikes, skateboards, scooters etc. in the downtown area and the BID has asked if the Council could review the Bicycle Ordinance and amend it to require the walking of bikes etc. on the sidewalks in the business district.

Mrs. Reilly offered a motion to authorize Borough Attorney Colao to draft an Ordinance in connection with the walking of bicycles, scooters, skateboards and the like on Third Avenue in the business district, seconded by Mrs. Venables. All in favor.

Eleanor Twomey, 108 Vroom Avenue, stated that the sidewalk portion on Morris and Washington Avenues in the business section are narrow as well and should be included in Ordinance. Mayor Naughton suggested that the Council representatives to the BID get in touch with Mr. Colao and give him the details.

Mrs. Reilly asked the Council Members to review the information she provided recently pertaining to permits for the use of the Borough's ball fields.

Mayor Naughton complimented Ms. Gillespie, Mr. Dempsey, Ms. Kirk and Mr. Finn on their efforts in connection with the installation of the new payroll and hand scan system. Mayor Naughton noted that the new system has vastly improved the efficiency of payroll processing and has saved the Borough money in payroll personnel.

Mr. Avakian reported on the Marucci Park project noting that it's complete. Mr. Avakian explained that since it was partially constructed with an open space grant from the county, it requires documentation assuring the county that it will continue to be used as a park.

Mr. Dempsey reported that residents seem to be very pleased with the south end pool. The Mayor acknowledged Bryan's commitment to the project including the hospitality he extended to the workers.
