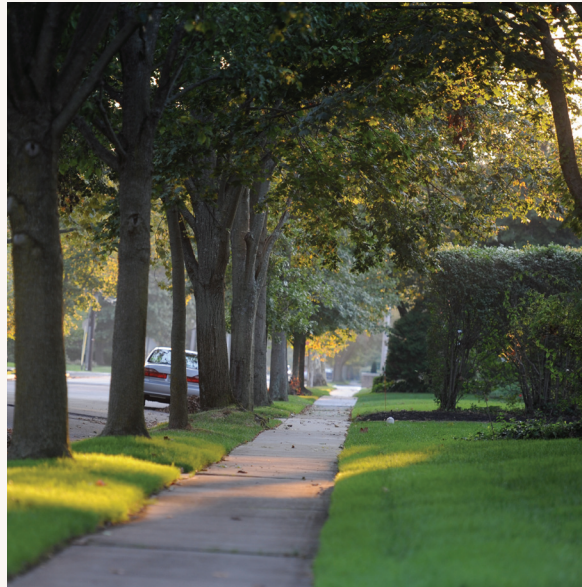

How do we request a curb side tree?

Once I receive a tree, what do I have to do to maintain it?

Water the tree (5 gallons) two times a week for the first year. Remove broken, damaged, diseased or dead branches to develop a good branch structure.

Do I need a permit to remove a tree?

Yes. You must obtain a permit to remove a sidewalk tree or any tree on your property as part of a construction project.
